Symposium Overview

Worldwide, Friedreich's Ataxia (FA) affects roughly one in 50,000 people, making it the most common in a group of related disorders called hereditary ataxias. While there is currently no cure for FA, efforts continue to be made towards research that will one day halt or even reverse disease progression. The Friedreich's Ataxia Program at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia is pleased to present this one-day symposium providing patients and families with up-to-date clinical information, therapeutic approaches and current research being conducted in the field of Friedreich's Ataxia.

Meeting Location

The symposium will be held Saturday, October 8, 2011 at the Crowne Plaza Valley Forge located in King of Prussia, Pa. Perfectly situated directly across from the King of Prussia Mall, the largest shopping mall in the United States. Valley Forge National Historic Park, the site of Washington's troops winter encampment during the Revolutionary war is also located less than two miles away.
