Last year, generous Energy Ball supporters helped FARA fund 46 groundbreaking research grants across 13 countries and five continents. This global collaboration attracts diverse expertise and ideas, ensuring we fund impactful research that leads to breakthroughs in knowledge and accelerates our pursuit of treatments and, ultimately, a cure.

Your support has also expanded our research infrastructure. In the last two years, we have doubled the number of sites now part of the FA Global Clinical Consortium (FA GCC). The USF Health Ataxia Research Center provides nation-leading clinical care and clinical research for patients with ataxia. The ataxias (which include Friedreich's ataxia (FA) and the Spinocerebellar ataxias) are a group of genetic diseases causing progressive loss of the coordination in the arms and legs, as well as deterioration in walking, speech and other critical functions, often along with other neurological and cardiac problems. Many of these diseases cause severe disability, and some are fatal.

The USF Health Ataxia Research Center is dedicated to finding effective treatments and cures for these debilitating diseases through its cutting edge clinical research programs, while also providing state-of-the-art clinical care by international authorities and researchers in the field. In addition to an intensive focus on translational and therapeutic research, the center also is developing more sensitive methods for diagnosis and a more comprehensive understanding of these diseases.

Can Help Sustain the FA Global Clinical Consortium (FA GCC)

FARA launched the Friedreich's Ataxia Global Clinical Consortium (FA GCC), in 2023, which expanded the number of clinical research sites from the existing 15 to 34 sites across 18 countries. The FA GCC is an international group of clinical research centers that work together to advance treatments and clinical care for individuals with Friedreich's ataxia. This structure will become the most valuable resource in planning and implementing clinical trials across all programs.

Since FARA's founding, one of the key priorities has been to grow the research field with smart, passionate and innovative scientists. FARA funded 14 new investigators in 2024. FARA grants include salary support for researchers such as lab technicians, graduate students, PhD candidates and post-doctoral fellows for their time at the lab bench carrying out experiments to answer key questions about FA and approaches to treatment. This work leads to enhanced understanding and meaningful breakthroughs for FA.

### **Can Help Develop Resources That Expedite Research and Support Patient Care**

FARA has identified the need for tools and resources that support patient care and build research capacity. An example of one such project was an update of the Clinical Management Guidelines in FA. These guidelines include best practice clinical management of the disease and are assembled by experts in the field. This resource helps ensure people with FA get care based on current information about the condition. FARA also provides funding for the creation, curation, and maintenance of the FA Cell Line Repository, which houses numerous characterized FA and control cell lines that are available to the research community. These resources save researchers on average seven months to one year.

FARA is funding several different types of biomarker studies which provide a window inside the activity of tissue and cells in FA. Biomarker studies include brain and spinal cord imaging, cardiac assessment, blood based biomarkers and wearable devices. These are innovative ways to measure changes in the disease with cutting edge technology. They not only provide insight into the disease process but may also allow for shorter clinical trial duration.

Due to the ongoing support from Energy Ball donors and participation from the patient community, FARA is able to invest in groundbreaking natural history clinical research. The UNIFAI study collects natural history data and improves the panel of outcome measures that can be used in FA clinical trials. Participation in this study allow researchers to collect over 1,000 data points that help accelerate the development of treatments for FA. Funding from FARA helps offset the costs of travel and testing.
